


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## Songs from Around the World



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# **Beginning Letter Sound**

Children identify the relationship between each letter symbol, the sound it makes, and that the letters put together form words. 

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# Science and Language

The iKnow ABC School and Home Adventure uses a multi-modality, multi-sensory, and multi-media method to teach children. Children learn about the animals and environment. Beginning letter sounds, symbol recognition and animal identification are reinforced everyday.

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# Achieve the Goal: Activate the Secret Letter

Children are asked to activate one animal's secret letter. Children see, hear, identify and say each animal's name and each beginning letter name, symbol, and sound. Children must achieve the daily goal to activate one secret letter in the animal alphabet. Children realize that their contribution matters.

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# Celebrate
